Pre-Competition Meeting

The Pre-Competition meeting will be held at COD in room SRC 2000 on Sunday March 4. Final information and logistics for the March 17 competition will be provided at this meeting. This is also the deadline for submitting reports and papers. These items are forwarded to the judges who will review them prior to the competition. Students who are submitting creative

works, such as, poetry, short stories, original essays, and music compositions will need to have them notarized. Please refer to your category's requirements and criteria for details on what should be submitted and how many copies.

January Enrichment - Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day

January's enrichment session was a full day of activities beginning with the 23rd Annual Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Scholarship Breakfast. This was



followed by our very first ACT-SO Black History Bowl competition, which was a fun, exciting, and competitive activity. Students were divided into (12) teams of 4 or 5 people each with team names of historical figures - Tubman, Du Bois, King, and Carver, to name a few.

Teams answered black history questions from different categories, such as, Arts, Politics, Business, Education, and Science. At the end of the first round, the top two scoring teams, Truth and Parks, went head to head for the championship. The game was close with team Truth edging out Parks to become the 1st ACT-SO Black History Bowl Champion with each team member receiving a power bank to help charge their phones when the battery is low.





After lunch the students participated in Mock Interviews and attended their category enrichment sessions. Student competing in Business, Humanities, STEM, and Visual Arts had one-on-one interviews where they discussed their project with volunteer interviewers. Interviewers asked questions to understand the project and its status and provided feedback to the students.

Performing Arts students performed their pieces to a panel of volunteers who provided critiques and feedback to the students.

The purpose of the mock interviews is to help students determine their readiness for the competition in March and to give themselves the

opportunity to make any necessary adjustments. Many thanks go to our volunteers and to Ellen Moore and Brenda Davis for leading the Mock Interview process.


TARGET: Science and Engineering Program at Fermilab
